Class B THE CHERTSEY SHOW TOP VASE Kindly sponsored by The Tobbley Cabin

1. The Top Vase class is for a vase of mixed flowering stems containing a total of between 5 and 10, taken from a minimum of two different kinds of plants. Please note: Different KINDS of plants, not varieties. The flowers must be fresh and home grown. No dried or silk flowers allowed.
2. The display is judged out of a total of 35 points: 25 points for colour, form, condition, quality and freshness of flowers and 10 points for overall presentation.
3. Stems must show flowers only; no seed heads or berries allowed.
4. The vase can be any shape as long as it is taller than it is wide at its widest point.
5. No accessories such as bows and additional foliage allowed. Natural foliage growing from the stem is allowed. Packing material, such as florist's foam is permitted.
6. **First, Second and Third place medals to be awarded for The Top Vase Class!**
